Step-by-Step Guide for Parish Respect Life Ministries

1. Read the USCCB “Pastoral Plan for Pro-Life Activities” (Find the link and a PDF at www.ccdoc.org/respectlife).

2. Seek the support and input of your pastor.

3. Find a date on your parish calendar to host a Respect Life meeting/information session. Plan a few weeks in advance and advertise in your parish bulletin and from the pulpit.

4. At the meeting have a sign-in/sign-up sheet and gather contact information from those who attend (i.e., name, email, address).

5. Invite other representatives to your first meeting (i.e., Catholic Charities Diocesan Respect Life Director, Knights of Columbus Representative, and Parish Council Representative).

6. Let your parishioners who attend the group be your guides to setting a schedule for regular meetings (i.e., twice a month, once a month, every other month).

7. Start with one ministry or event (i.e., a January Roe v. Wade event or an October Respect Life month event).

8. Share your meeting highlights, upcoming events and Respect Life news in your bulletin.

Goals of a Respect Life Ministry

The goals of a Respect Life ministry are never ending during this time when the very issue of life is devalued at so many levels. It can seem overwhelming to direct your group on issues about which your members are passionate. The following goals should provide a backbone for the one area or multiple areas your group chooses to focus on despite the size of your group.

1. **Become informed** - about life issues using this booklet and the resources provided.
2. **Remain informed** - by visiting the USCCB and Human Life Action websites (included in this booklet).
3. **Inform others** - about the sanctity of human life, of the radical nature of the 1973 Supreme Court abortion decisions, and the consequent need to restore legal protection for all human life through protective legislation.
4. **Pray** - as a respect life group for the valuing of all human life.
5. **Educate** - within your parish on life issues.
6. **Support** - pro-life legislation at the state and national level. Use Catholic Voice NC and Human Life Action (see legislative advocacy websites on the next page).
7. **Work as a group** – to organize, recruit volunteers, respond to pro-life action alerts and raise funds for pro-life activities and local pregnancy centers.

8. **Use special months** – for focused action such as October (Respect Life month) and January (the Roe v. Wade Decision was handed down on January 22nd). Use these months to spend extra time praying for Respect Life and planning an event. These are great months to kick-start your new group.



The Joyful Mysteries

The Annunciation:

For parents facing an unexpected pregnancy, that they lovingly accept the precious life God has entrusted to their care.

The Visitation:

That the family and friends of expectant parents might reach out and support them as they prepare to meet their child face to face.

The Nativity:

That the love of the Blessed Mother and the Christ Child may be a source of strength for every expectant mother, especially mothers living in poverty, and that they both will be surrounded by joy and love.

The Presentation:

That fathers of young children will model St. Joseph in devoutly practicing their faith, so that they lead their children to God by their words and example.

The Finding of Jesus in the Temple:

For all children who have been lost and forgotten, that they may be led to a place where they are treasured, protected and loved.

While its Respect Life Program focuses on the respect for human life during its most vulnerable and defenseless stages, Catholic Charities promotes a respect for human life and dignity for many thousands of people – for example, individuals and families who are: struggling with poverty and food insecurity; escaping violence and persecution and seeking a new home in our diocese; facing mental health crises; needing a dignified burial.
