Housing for refugees – Please tell us about the housing you have to offer. We will keep your information on file and reach out to you as needed.

- Location
- Is it private/independent? (We are not able to accept shared housing/living space).
- How many bedrooms?
- Is it near public transportation? Or within walking distance to stores?
- Is it temporary? (if so for long?)
- Is a long-term option available?
- Would you consider housing multiple adult males? (sometimes our arrivals are single or had to leave their families behind).
- Would you consider housing families with small children?
- Would you offer your housing for free or for a reduce rate?
- Any other pertinent information.

Employment – we love to hear about employment opportunities. Tell us a few things about the employment opportunities you may have available:

- Location
- Type of work
- Is a language barrier ok? (Many refugees speak limited or no English)

Other Services (i.e. medical services, community resources) – often we have to focus on more immediate needs (i.e. housing, food, transportation); however, we love to hear about other resources. Please tell us few details about the resources you may have available:

- Location and service, you have to offer (i.e. therapist, community event)
- Details about the service you offer (i.e. pro-bono counseling, group hike)
- Is a language barrier ok? (Many evacuees do not speak English)

Clothing donations – Thank you, but we are <u>not</u> accepting donations at Catholic Charities. Please share them with other organizations (i.e. ABCCM, Black Mountain Home for Children)

Furniture and household items – Thank you, but we are <u>not</u> accepting furniture and household items. (Any specific needs will be listed on the "Needed Items" listed below)

Donations of other items – We currently have a signup that support our current refugee needs. Click on the *Sign-up* link below.
